
Mass with the Anointing of the sick

The encyclical 'Laudato Si': ('On Care for Our Common Home')

4. The principle of the common good: Integral or human ecology "is inseparable from the notion of the common good". In the contemporary world, where "injustices abound and growing numbers of people are deprived of basic human rights and considered expendable", working for the common good means to make choices in solidarity based on "a preferential option for the poorest".

5. Justice between generations: the common good also regards future generations: "We can no longer speak of sustainable development apart from intergenerational solidarity", without, however, forgetting the poor of today "whose life on this earth is brief and who cannot keep on waiting".

V. LINES OF APPROACH AND ACTION

This chapter addresses the question of what we can and must do. Analyses are not enough. For Pope Francis it is imperative that practical proposals not be developed in an ideological, superficial or reductionist way. "There are certain environmental issues where it is not easy to achieve a broad consensus... The Church does not presume to settle scientific questions or to replace politics. But I am concerned to encourage an honest and open debate, so that particular interests or ideologies will not prejudice the common good".

1. Dialogue on the environment: "Interdependence obliges us to think of one world with a common plan", proposing solutions "from a global perspective, and not simply to defend the interests of a few countries". The Encyclical is not afraid to judge international dynamics severely: "Recent World Summits on the environment have failed to live up to expectations because, due to lack of political will, they were unable to reach truly meaningful and effective global agreements on the environment". Instead, as Popes have repeated several times starting with Pacem in terris, what is needed are forms and instruments for global governance: "an agreement on systems of governance for the whole range of the so-called -global commons".

2. Dialogue for new national and local policies: "Local individuals and groups ...] are able to instill a greater sense of responsibility, a strong sense of community, a readiness to protect others, a spirit of creativity" and a deep love for one's own land. *Politics and economy need to abandon the logic of short-sighted efficiency, focused on profit alone and short-term electoral success.* (To be continued....)



POPE FRANCIS

The Saints and Blesseds of Canada



BLESSED FREDERIC JANSOONE
 August 5

On August 5, the Church in Canada celebrates the life and witness of Blessed Frederic Janssoone. The son of a prosperous and devout farming family, Frederic Janssoone was born on November 19, 1838, in Ghyselvedge, in the North of France. His father died when Frederic was only nine. He attended secondary school in Hazebrouck and then Dunkirk, but in 1856, he had to leave school to support his mother. He found work as an errand boy, and eventually had great success as a travelling salesman. After his mother died, in 1861, he was able to complete his studies. In 1864, he entered the novitiate of the Franciscan Order of Friars Minor in Amiens. He was ordained a priest in 1870. In 1881, Father Frederic made his first trip to Canada to establish an annual collection for the Holy Places and to submit to the Bishops a plan for the Commissariat for the Holy Land in Canada. He paved the way for the reestablishment in Canada of the Order of Friars Minor, which had ceased to exist with the death of the last Recollet in 1812. Father Frederic travelled from one parish to another in several Quebec dioceses, and went door-to-door selling his works. The profit from his sales went toward the establishment of several communities of consecrated life: the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary, the Poor Clares, the Franciscans of Trois-Rivières, and the Sister Adorers of the Precious Blood of Joliette. He died of stomach cancer in Montreal on August 4, 1916. Father Frederic is buried in Trois-Rivières. He was beatified by Saint John Paul II on September 25, 1988.
