
Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 11, 2018

The liturgical season of Lent (Ash Wednesday Feb.14th)

If you go into your local Chapters or Barnes and Nobles Bookstore you would likely discover that self-help books have become a growth industry. There are books on how to make your health better through dieting (no more deserts) and exercise (no pain, no gain). Other books will tell you how to improve your performance at work so you can get a better job with more pay (work harder and smarter). Some books will help you get better returns on your investments so you can retire early (save now, spend later). Finally, there are books to help you improve your relationships with others (maybe even your sex life) and develop a happier life. So why do people who desire self-improvement have such a problem with Lent? The season invites us to take a good look at ourselves and discover the parts of our life which need improvement. It gives us the same tools to acheive this goal as the authors of self-help books: discipline, sacrifice and commitment. Lent gives us the chance to discover we are better people than we think. Pope Francis - General Audience February 7, 2018

Dear brothers and sisters:

In our catechesis on the Eucharist, we now turn to the culmination of the Liturgy of the Word in the Gospel and in the homily. The Gospel sheds the light of the mystery of Christ on the scriptural readings that precede it. By our acclamations and the rites that accompany its proclamation, we venerate the Gospel as the living and saving word of God, who speaks to us in the midst of the liturgical assembly and awaits our response. This dialogue between the Lord and his people continues in the homily, which seeks to make God's word incarnate in our hearts and in our lives. The homily draws us more deeply into the mystery of the communion in Christ that we celebrate in the Eucharist. The homily makes demands on both the homilist and the congregation; both must be disposed to consider how the word of God applies to the here and now of our lives, even when its summons to conversion proves challenging or painful. Familiarity with the Gospel through private reading and reflection can enable us appreciate ever more fully the beauty and richness of the readings of each Sunday's Mass.

So what, in essence, is fasting?

It's "the deprivation of the good, in order to make a decision for a greater good," explained Deacon Carnazzo. It is most commonly associated with abstention from food, although it can also take the form of giving up other goods like comforts and entertainment. The current fasting obligation for Latin Catholics in the United States & Canada is this: all over the age of 14 must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays in Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, adults age 18 to 59 must fast – eating no more than one full meal and two smaller meals that together do not add up in quantity to the full meal. Catholics, "if possible," can continue the Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil, the U.S. Catholic Bishops Conference adds. Other Fridays throughout the year (aside from Friday within the Octave of Easter) "are penitential days and times throughout the entire Church," according to Canon Law 1250. Catholics once abstained from meat on all Fridays, but the U.S. bishops received permission from the Holy See for Catholics to substitute another sacrifice or perform an act of charity instead. https://www.catholicnewsagency.com/ news/whats-the-point-of-fasting-anyway-29180 to read more.
