### Pope Francis - General Audience February 14, 2018

Dear brothers and sisters:

In our catechesis on Holy Mass, we now turn to the Profession of Faith and the Universal Prayer of all the Christian faithful. In the Liturgy of the Word, after the homily and a time of silence, the whole assembly professes its faith: we recite the Creed, which bridges the sacraments of Baptism and the Eucharist. In doing so, we respond to what we have heard and received; this will lead us, in turn, to the Sacrament of the Eucharist. The Apostles' Creed, which is the Church of Rome's Baptismal Creed, may be appropriately taken up especially in Lent and Eastertide. Particularly on Sundays and feast days, we then offer the prayers of all the faithful: "for holy Church, for the civil authorities, for those oppressed by various needs, for all mankind, and for the salvation of the entire world." After each intention, we pray together: "Lord, graciously hear us" (or similar words), confident that God takes care of his sons and daughters.

# Fasting A reflection by Bishop Bergie

Fasting is one of the pillars of Lent and it provides a significant means of helping us listen to the Lord. It is a form of self-denial as we grow in our ability to say no to self and yes to God. Fasting provides a spiritual cleansing where we "make room" in our souls for God. This also provides an opportunity to allow the things that are hidden to move to the surface to be exposed to God's grace and mercy. Things move from darkness to the light of Christ. Ultimately, the purpose of fasting is to help us focus on God; to hunger for His presence and to listen to His words. The great St. Augustine provides the merits of fasting, especially for those living a life of celibacy: "Fasting purifies the soul. It lifts up the mind and brings the body into subjection to the spirit. It makes the heart contrite and humble, scatters the clouds of desire, puts out the flames of lust and enkindles the true light of chastity."

### MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR LENT 2018

"Because of the increase of inquity, the love of many will grow cold" (Mt 24:12)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Once again, the Pasch of the Lord draws near! In our preparation for Easter, God in his providence offers us each year the season of Lent as a "sacramental sign of our conversion".[1] Lent summons us, and enables us, to come back to the Lord wholeheartedly and in every aspect of our life. With this message, I would like again this year to help the entire Church experience this time of grace anew, with joy and in truth. I will take my cue from the words of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew: "Because of the increase of iniquity, the love of many will grow cold" (24:12).

These words appear in Christ's preaching about the end of time. They were spoken in Jerusalem, on the Mount of Olives, where the Lord's passion would begin. In reply to a question of the disciples, Jesus foretells a great tribulation and describes a situation in which the community of believers might well find itself: amid great trials, false prophets would lead people astray and the love that is the core of the Gospel would grow cold in the hearts of many.
